NVFC VISIONING

When I (Colin) first began reading the Bible in my early 20s, I was puzzled by how often the admonition to "love one another" appeared. As a newbie to the faith, this seemed so obvious and central that I could not quite wrap my head around why it needed to be reinforced so often.

Not too much later, I began to understand. This is hard work. Congregations are populated with people like me... as well as those who are simple and easy to love.

Our third query in the early part of our visioning process is focused on the essential aspect of being in the church. You can respond to the question, "What will it look like for us to be a community that loves each other deeply?" through this link or by leaving a handwritten note on the back wall of the sanctuary of the Meetinghouse.

One of the things I appreciate about the New Testament is the way it describes "love for one another" in very practical terms. It is not all warm feelings and kind gestures. Instead, distinctly Christian love is expressed through radical, sacrificial, and concrete acts and attitudes that characterize our life together daily. And though these expressions of love are not restricted to those within the community by any means, this is our practice field in which we learn to process what we profess about ourselves and our experience of God.

As we prayerfully respond to the query, maybe we can be as courageous as the New Testament is clearly articulating what love-in-action means in order to keep practicing it more gracefully and faithfully together.
