As we lean into the work and witness of "being a community of Quaker ministers who seek to follow Jesus faithfully, love each other deeply, and continue His ministry in the world," 2025 offers us an opportunity to stretch ourselves. This year's visioning process has helped us identify new ministry priorities and avenues for deepening community, service, and spiritual growth.



Recently, we focused on a passage from 1 Timothy inviting the church to "do good together."
